This exhibition looks at the extraordinary life of Ted Ryko and his 1914 solo bicycle journey from Adelaide to Darwin. Ryko was an avid photographer and writer who travelled extensively in the Territory's Top End. He recorded the people, events, scenes and stories he saw in the bush and in the process, created a stunning visual record of Australia's last frontier.



The winner will be announced at the awards ceremony on Tuesday 1 July.




