RATES OF COMPENSATION CONTRIBUTIONS

I, DARYL WILLIAM MANZIE, the Minister for Asian Relations, Trade and Industry —

- (a) in pursuance of section 47(1) of the *Motor Vehicles Act* and with reference to section 43 of the *Interpretation Act*, revoke the instrument specifying rates of compensation contributions dated 17 May 1996 and appearing in *Gazette* No. G22 dated 29 May 1996; and
- (b) in pursuance of section 47(1) of the *Motor Vehicles Act*, on the recommendation of the Territory Insurance Office, specify the rates set out in the Schedule to be the rates of compensation contributions to be paid —
 - (i) in respect of —
 - (A) the grant or renewal of the registration of a motor vehicle;
 - (B) the grant or renewal of a pastoral vehicle permit;
 - (C) the grant of an exemption from registration of a visiting motor vehicle under section 8A of the Act;
 - (D) the grant of a licence under section 137 of the Act; or
 - (E) the issuing of a trader's plate; or
 - (ii) at the time of applying for registration or re-registration under the *Interstate Road Transport Act 1985* of the Commonwealth of a motor vehicle or a trailer,

as specified in the Schedule, on and from 1 July 1998.

TENNANT CREEK TOWN COUNCIL DECLARATION OF RATES AND CHARGES FOR 1998/99

Notice is hereby given that pursuant to Section 75 of the Local Government Act, the following Rates and Charges were declared by the Tennant Creek Town Council on **09 June 1998** under Section 65 of the Local Government Act in respect of the year ending **30 June 1999**.

1. (a) That pursuant to Section 65(1) of the Local Government Act, that Tennant Creek Town Council ("the council") adopts as its method of determining the assessed value of all rateable land in the Municipality, the Unimproved Capital Value as it appears on the Valuation Roll prepared by the Valuer General in accordance with the Valuation of Land Act.
- (b) That pursuant to section 65(3) of the Local Government Act, the Council adopts the amount of **\$11,365,400.00** as the total of the assessed value of all rateable and non-rateable land within the Municipality, being the amount as calculated from the Valuation Roll.

2. That pursuant to Section 64(1) of the Local Government Act, The Tennant Creek Town Council hereby declare that in respect of the year ending 30 June 1999:

(a) the amount it intends to raise for general purposes by rates is **\$976,325.03.**

(b) those rates will be raised by the application of differential rates with a minimum amount payable in the application of those differential rates as follows:-

(i) a rate of **11.4929%** of the unimproved capital value of all rateable land within **Zone B1** within the meaning of the Tennant Creek Town Plan being a relevant control plan under the Planning Act with the minimum amount payable in the application of that rate being calculated by multiplying the number of residential units on the respective parcel of land or the number 1(which ever is greater) by the sum of **\$230.00.**

(ii) a rate of **10.3946%** of the unimproved capital value of all rateable land within **Zone B2** within the meaning of the Tennant Creek Town Plan being a relevant control plan under the Planning Act with the minimum amount payable in the application of that rate being calculated by multiplying the number of residential units on the respective parcel of land or the number 1(which ever is greater) by the sum of **\$230.00.**

(iii) a rate of **9.6527%** of the unimproved capital value of all rateable land within **Zone B4** within the meaning of the Tennant Creek Town Plan being a relevant control plan under the Planning Act with the minimum amount payable in the application of the rate being, the sum of **\$2,010.00.**

(iv) a rate of **9.3838%** of the unimproved capital value of all rateable land within **Zone B5** within the meaning of the Tennant Creek Town Plan being a relevant control plan under the Planning Act with the minimum amount payable in the application of that rate being calculated by multiplying the number of residential units on the respective parcel of land or the number 1(which ever is greater) by the sum of **\$230.00.**

(v) a rate of **9.4647%** of the unimproved capital value of all rateable land within **Zones I1,I2 and I3** within the meaning of the Tennant Creek Town Plan being a relevant control plan under the Planning Act with the

minimum amount payable in the application of the rate being calculated by multiplying the number of residential units on the respective parcel of land or the number 1(which ever is greater) by the sum of **\$1,399.00.**

- (vi) a rate of **8.5887%** of the unimproved capital value of all rateable land within **Zone S1,S2** within the meaning of the Tennant Creek Town Plan being a relevant control plan under the Planning Act with the minimum amount payable in the application of that rate being calculated by multiplying the number of residential units on the respective parcel of land or the number 1(which ever is greater) by the sum of **\$230.00.**

- (vii) a rate of **7.8486%** of the unimproved capital value of all rateable land within **Zone O2** within the meaning of the Tennant Creek Town Plan being a relevant control plan under the Planning Act with the minimum amount payable in the application of that rate being calculated by multiplying the number of residential units on the respective parcel of land or the number 1(which ever is greater) by the sum of **\$230.00.**

- (viii) a rate of **7.3441%** of the unimproved capital value of all rateable land within **Zone Sp.PI** within the meaning of the Tennant Creek Town Plan being a relevant control plan under the Planning Act with the minimum amount payable in the application of that rate being calculated by multiplying the number of residential units on the respective parcel of land or the number 1(which ever is greater) by the sum of **\$230.00.**

- (ix) a rate of **13.3169%** of the unimproved capital value of all rateable land within **Zone R1** within the meaning of the Tennant Creek Town Plan being a relevant control plan under the Planning Act with the minimum amount payable in the application of the rate being, the sum of **\$589.00.**

- (x) a rate of **7.2309%** of the unimproved capital value of all rateable land within **Zone R2** within the meaning of the Tennant Creek Town Plan being a relevant control plan under the Planning Act with the minimum amount payable in the application of that rate being calculated by multiplying the number of residential units on the respective parcel of land or the number 1(which ever is greater) by the sum of **\$230.00.**

- (xi) a rate of **6.5203%** of the unimproved capital value of all rateable land within **Zone R3** within the meaning of the Tennant Creek Town Plan being a relevant control plan under the Planning Act with the minimum amount payable in the application of that rate being calculated by multiplying the number of residential units on the respective parcel of land or the number 1 (which ever is greater) by the sum of **\$230.00**.

- (xii) a rate of **7.0294%** of the unimproved capital value of all rateable land within **Zone R4** within the meaning of the Tennant Creek Town Plan being a relevant control plan under the Planning Act with the minimum amount payable in the application of that rate being calculated by multiplying the number of residential units on the respective parcel of land or the number 1 (which ever is greater) by the sum of **\$230.00**.

- (xiii) a rate of **10.6690%** of the unimproved capital value of all rateable land within **Zone R5** within the meaning of the Tennant Creek Town Plan being a relevant control plan under the Planning Act with the minimum amount payable in the application of that rate being calculated by multiplying the number of residential units on the respective parcel of land or the number 1 (which ever is greater) by the sum of **\$230.00**.

- (xiv) a rate of **1.4931%** of the unimproved capital value of all rateable land within **RB** within the meaning of the Tennant Creek Town Plan being a relevant control plan under the Planning Act with the minimum amount payable in the application of that rate being calculated by multiplying the number of residential units on the respective parcel of land or the number 1 (which ever is greater) by the sum of **\$230.00**.

- (xv) a rate of **1.5315%** of the unimproved capital value of all rateable land within any other parcel of land within the municipality with the minimum amount payable in the application of that rate being calculated by multiplying the number of residential units on the respective parcel of land or the number 1 (which ever is greater) by the sum of **\$230.00**.

- (c) That whereas in relation to the Council's function of sanitation and garbage, the Council provides or is willing and able to provide a regular garbage service to all land in the Municipality (except such land as the Council from time to time determines excluded from the provisions of such service.), the Council, pursuant to section 74 of Local Government Act hereby declares the amount of the annual charge for the regular garbage service comprising a maximum of one '240 litre garbage bin' collected weekly to be **\$139.00**. The total amount it intends to raise by garbage charge is **\$197,184.00** for 1998/99 provided that:
- (i) should a ratepayer so request, up to a maximum of a further one '240 litre garbage bin' will be collected in conjunction with the regular **weekly** garbage service for a further annual charge of **\$139.00**
 - (ii) should a ratepayer request for a daily pick up garbage bin/bins will be collected on **each day** of the week (other than Sunday and public holidays and those days on which the regular weekly garbage service is provided), ie 5 days, for a further annual charge of **\$408.00**
 - (iii) should a ratepayer so request to not have their rubbish removed by Council and prefer to remove their rubbish to the Municipal Dump themselves, the **Dump fee** of **\$1064.00** will apply.
 - (iv) in accordance with Council Policy there shall be no discount for vacant Lots for garbage charges for 1998/99.
- (d) That for the purposes of Section 80 of Local Government Act the Council determines that rates and charges shall for the year ending 30 June 1999 be payable within 30 days (06 August 1998) from the date of issue of the Rate Notices, with discount or within 120 days (03 November 1998) from the date of issue of the Rate Notices, without discount.
- (e) That pursuant to Section 81 of Local Government Act ,the council determines that a discount of 5% of the rates payable (excluding charges) in respect of the year ending 30 June 1999 shall be granted to persons liable to pay rates who, within 30 days from the date of issue of the Rate Notices, pay the full amount of the rates and charges payable provided that:
- (i) in the case of pensioners receiving other forms of rating concessions, such discounts shall apply only to the portion of rates actually paid by such pensioners.

- (ii) the discount shall not apply in respect of any parcel of land on which any amount less than the full annual amount is payable by way of rates and charges, including arrears.
- (iii) all other rates, charges and other monies due, owing or payable by the ratepayer to the council have been paid.
- (f) That Pursuant to Section 82 of Local Government Act, the Council determines that the penalty for the late payment of rates and charges shall be calculated at the rate of 16% per annum of the unpaid rates and charges calculated on a daily basis after the expiry of 120 days (from 04 November 1998 onwards) from the date of issue of Rate Notices until the date payment in full is made in accordance with Section 82 (3) of the Local Government Act.
