## *Sports and Recreation*

**Community Youth Centre** - The concrete slab has been poured and is creating much interest in Batchelor town. The builders have begun to erect the building and we hope to have this completed within the next couple of weeks. Students from Batchelor Area School have a never ending stream of ideas and we have already formed a working group. *The future of the "Centre" rests firmly with us* – the kids, parents, family and friends all ‘talking, working and making it happen’. So please gather ideas with your young ones, offer your services and skills in your specific trade, volunteer to join the roster as a supervisor at the “Centre”(Ochre Card needed). **Boxing Fitness Classes at Batchelor Area School Hall** – Progressing nicely with the 4pm class for the young ones and the 5pm class for 15 years and up. These classes have inspired a Tuesday 5pm fitness class for those who are keen for more.

**Auskick** – A massive interest from local parents in the Batchelor region is driving this project. We invited the NT Auskick representative for the rural area (Adam Moedt) to come to the local Markets on 13<sup>th</sup> May which generated much interest. A sign up day on Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> in Batchelor saw 25 youngsters between 4 and 12 years start their budding AFL careers. The 2<sup>nd</sup> session on the 26<sup>th</sup> May was windy and cold – yet 32 young ones came along. Adam is also in touch with Adelaide River School to coordinate a meeting with students there. We hope to have sessions in Batchelor and also Adelaide River (dependant on the interest).

**Skate ramps** The mobile ramp that was used between both Adelaide River and Batchelor has become a permanent fixture on the established concrete slab at the Batchelor Oval. It requires sanding and painting with a rust proof base colour. We hope to hold an art workshop in the mid year holiday program with local children and paint up the ramp. This project was funded by Department of Housing, Local Government and Regional Services. Funding also includes a new skate ramp which is about to be installed at the Adelaide River Oval.

**Batchelor Monthly Markets** were held on Mother’s Day in May amid a continuous flow of visitors and locals. What a BIG day we all had. ‘Open Gardens’ at the Batchelor Pad and the markets under the lovely shade trees at the Oval created a wonderful mix for visitors and our Coomalie community.



**June Monthly Markets will be held at the Adelaide River Showgrounds in conjunction with the Show.** The annual Show is to be held on the 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> June at the ARSS Club. In support of the rural community show and to assist with additional attractions the market stall holders have agreed to set up at the show on Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> June.

## Dogs in the Coomalie Shire

All dogs within the Coomalie Region over 3 months of age must be registered. You can register your dog at the Coomalie Council Office or the Adelaide River Office (AR office open on Wednesday mornings 8am - 10am)

**Dogs must be on a leash at all times in any public area otherwise they will be impounded. Fees apply if your dog has been put in the pound.**

Impoundment fees are initially \$70.00 for registered dogs, \$140.00 for unregistered dogs then \$50.00 per day while kept in Pound. Registered dogs are kept for 3 days and unregistered dogs are kept for 2 days.

Unregistered dogs must be registered before being released from the pound.

### **Registration Fees**

Town Dogs - A limit of 2 dogs per household applies

Entire Dog                 \$30.00

Sterilised Dog           \$6.00

Concessions              1/2 price

Rural Dogs - Registration is free and no limits apply

The Batchelor Interpretive Museum is a work in progress with renovation and repairs still happening.


