

Britney flies over Ed's head

LOS ANGELES: *Modern Family* star Ed O'Neill lost a few cool points with his daughter when he failed to recognise US songbird Britney Spears at an airport.

The veteran actor (pictured) was just about to board a plane to Hawaii at Los Angeles International Airport, when he spotted a fan heading towards him.

"I was flying alone to Hawaii and I was waiting for my flight to board," he told *Finding Dory* co-star Ellen DeGeneres during a recent appearance on her US talk show. "They told me the flight was boarding and... I saw a woman approaching me..."

"I was leaving; she came up and said, 'Oh, Mr O'Neill, I love *Modern Family*, and you're my favourite on the show'."

"So she sat there and we took it (photo)."

Spears then posted the snap on social media.

"So the next day my manager texts me and goes, 'What is this? 53,000 likes? It's Britney Spears'," the actor added.

"My daughter, Sophia, she said 'you are a moron'."

Extraterrestrial sitcom star dies

NEW YORK: Michu Meszaros, a former circus performer who played Alf in the popular American sitcom, has died, according to his manager, Dennis Varga.

Meszaros had been rushed to a Los Angeles hospital several days ago

after he was found unresponsive in his home, and had been in a coma since. He was 76.

Born in Budapest, Hungary, he stood less than three feet tall and since his teens had performed in numerous circuses, including the Ringling

Brothers and Barnum & Bailey Circus.

He had also appeared in films, including *Big Top Pee-wee* and *Freaked*, as well as on TV.

He was best known costumed as the alien title character of *ALF*, which aired from 1986 to 1990.

Heard calls in the cops

LOS ANGELES: Representatives for Amber Heard have called the police after her estranged husband Johnny Depp's aides reportedly violated a court order and raided the former couple's home.

The actress filed to end the couple's 15-month marriage in May, and then obtained a temporary domestic violence restraining order against Depp, accusing him of abusing her throughout their marriage.

Under the terms of the order, the *Pirates of the Caribbean* star has to stay at least 100 yards away from the Los Angeles home he shared with Heard, local law enforcement sources told TMZ.com.

But, reports suggest that members of Depp's camp entered the home on Monday and began taking items from the property, removing decor from walls and gathering furniture which they insisted be-

longed to the actor. Although Depp himself was not present, Heard's team reportedly called in Los Angeles Police Department officials on the grounds of a possible violation of the restraining order.

While the terms of the ruling include a "move-out order", which allows Depp to recover his clothes and any personal items needed until a hearing set for Friday, Heard's legal team believes Depp's people are pushing the boundaries of the order.

Meanwhile, sources close to the actor told TMZ his team is acquiring his "personal items" and insist their actions are within the scope of what the order allows.

It is unclear whether Heard was at home when the alleged raid took place, but Depp is currently lying low in the Bahamas as their divorce battle continues.
